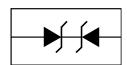




Description

The PESDUC2FD5VB protects sensitive semiconductor components from damage or upset due to electrostatic discharge (ESD) and other voltage induced transient events. They feature large cross-sectional area junctions for conducting high transient currents, offer desirable electrical characteristics for board level protection, such as fast response time, low operating voltage. It gives designer the flexibility to protect one bi-directional line in applications where arrays are not practical.

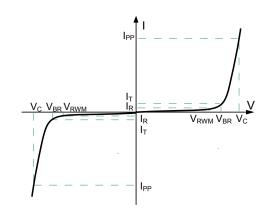

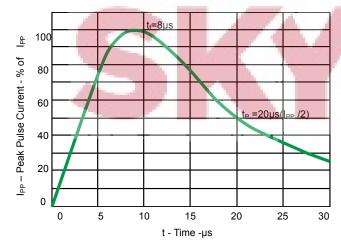


Fig 1.Pulse Waveform

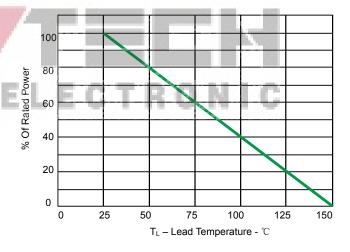


Fig 2.Power Derating Curve

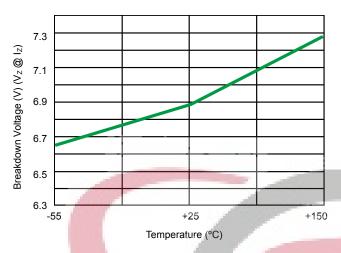


Fig 3. Typical Breakdown Voltage vs. Temperature

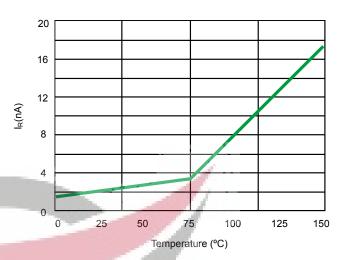


Fig 4. Typical Leakage Current vs. Temperature

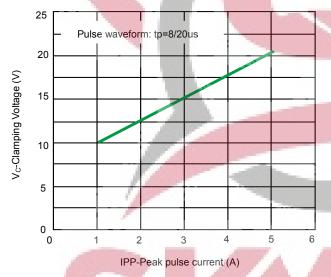


Fig 5. Clamping voltage vs. Peak pulse current

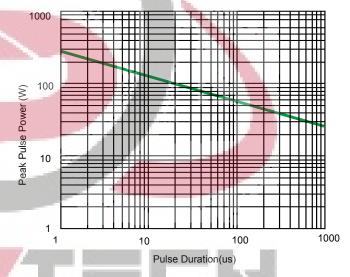
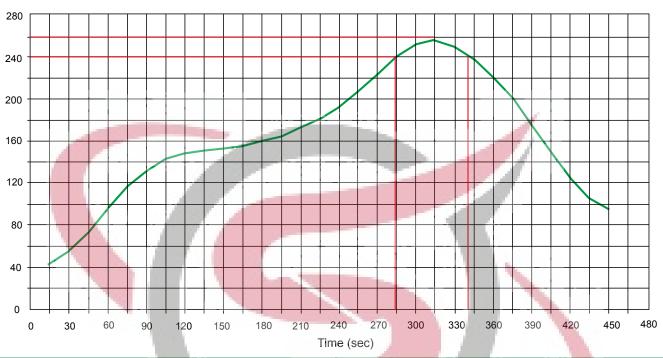


Fig 6. Non-Repetitive Peak Pulse Power vs. Pulse time

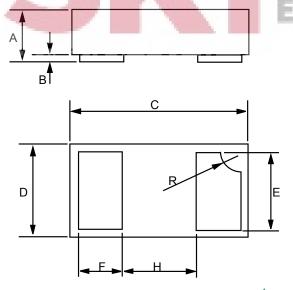


PCB Design

For TVS diodes a low-ohmic and low-inductive path to chassis earth is absolutely mandatory in order to achieve good ESD protection. Novices in the area of ESD protection should take following suggestions to heart:

- Do not use stubs, but place the cathode of the TVS diode directly on the signal trace.
- Do not make false economies and save copper for the ground connection.
- Place via holes to ground as close as possible to the anode of the TVS diode.
- Use as many via holes as possible for the ground connection.
- Keep the length of via holes in mind! The longer the more inductance they will have.
